
Asian and Pacific Islander Population in the United States

There are 1.2 million Native Hawaiian Pacific Islanders (NHPI) in the United States.

by Race, United States (alone or in combination)




Asian Pacific Islander Population in Minnesota

There are over 6,000 NHPI in Minnesota.





Growth in Populations of Color Minnesota, 1960-2010




Asian Population by Citizenship Status




Increased visibility: Percent Asian, 2000




Increased visibility: Percent Asian, 2010



Increased visibility: 2000 Census Tract- Percent Asian




Increased Visibility: 2010 Census Tract - Percent Asian

Minnesota, 1990-2010



- **Southeast Asians**
 - MN has a large SE Asian population
 - 59.5% are foreign-born
 - Largest SE Asian group is the Hmong making up 27%
 - Vietnamese make up 11.1%

South Asian

- Among Asians, South Asians had the largest population growth
- 80.7% are foreign-born
- Asian Indians make up 15.5% of MN's Asian population





East Asians

- 64.2% are foreign-born
- Chinese are the third largest Asian group in MN and make up 11.7%
- Koreans 8.6%, MN has one of the largest population of adopted Koreans



Ten Largest Asian Populations


by selected categories, MN (alone or in combination)

Minnesota Popualtion Pyramid







Educational attainment of Asian Population Minnesota, 1990-2010














Asian population by nativity and educational attainment Minnesota, 2010




Educational Attainment

- Percent with a B.A. or higher





















Child Poverty

Highlights

Highlights

- As a whole, the Asian community has improved in the areas of educational attainment, employment and poverty in the past 3 decades.
- Asians have a diverse population, but there is also intra-ethnic diversity
- Many Southeast Asians are working in low skilled occupations and facing challenges in the areas of educational attainment and poverty.
- A large portion of the South Asian ancestry group are foreignborn population.
- The East Asian ancestry group is doing relatively well in the areas of educational attainment, employment and poverty.
